

MALACHI K. YORK TIMELINE

- Jan. 15, 1993** Malachi York moves to 476 acre property on 404 Shady Dale Rd in Putnam CO, GA. The objective is to develop an Egyptian Theme Park, creating jobs for local residents.
- Jun. 26, 1996** Property on 404 Shady Dale Road brings thousands of tourists as it becomes a Landmark in Putnam County.
- Jan 01, 1997** Howard R Sills takes office as Putnam County Sheriff.
- Apr. 10, 1997** Legal disputes over zoning and building begins with Putnam Co Sheriff Sills and County Officials beginning a pattern of harassment and a subsequent Lawsuit.
- May 5, 1998** Sheriff Sills Sues Malachi K. York over building disputes as a contentious atmosphere builds between County Officials and Mr. York.
- Oct. 13, 1998** Before taking his Oath of Office as a Federal Judge, C. Ashley Royal is the legal Authority (Attorney) for Oconee Hospital as Lawsuit ensues involving the Medical Malpractice which caused the death of Malachi York's common law father in-law.
- Sep. 15, 1999** Civil Rights Leader **Rev. Al Sharpton** visits 404 Shady Dale Road and proclaims County Officials are targeting Mr. York because of his teachings and his ability to uplift the hearts and minds of African Americans in Middle Georgia.
- Apr. 27, 2001** Rainbow/PUSH Coalition leader **Jesse Jackson** visits the 476 acre property pledging solidarity with Mr. York in ongoing zoning disputes. **Macon Mayor Jack Ellis** is among those attending Jackson's speech.
- January 1, 2002** C. Ashley Royal is newly appointed Federal Judge over the Middle District of Georgia and begins his commission after receiving a nomination from President George W. Bush.
- Feb. 8, 2002** York wins Lawsuit involving zoning and building disputes over the 476 acre property on 404 Shady Dale Rd, Eatonton GA.
- Mar. 7, 2002** After the 6 yrs of zoning disputes and harassment on the part of Local Officials, the buildings on the property at 404 Shady Road are cleared for use.
- May 08, 2002** Federal State and Local Law Enforcement officers conduct a violent arrest of Malachi K. York and Kathy Johnson and later raid the 476 acre property.
- May 09, 2002** Mr. York is officially indicted and pleads Not Guilty to charges of conspiracy to transport minors across state lines and child molestation.
- May 15, 2002** Bail for Mr. York is denied.
- Jan. 23, 2003** Under duress, Malachi K. York agrees to a Guilty Plea bargain, pleading guilty to 2 Federal charges with a recommended sentence of 15 years and would make him eligible for parole in 12 yrs. The next day he pleads guilty to state charges.
- Jun. 30, 2003** Mr. York reiterates to Federal Court Judge that he is an Indigenous Sovereign and is not subject to Federal Law having an inalienable right to be tried by fellow

indigenous Sovereigns, and having explained this several times. Mr. York also states the Attorney encouraged him under duress to take a plea bargain.

York Timeline Cont'd

- Jul. 18, 2003** Judge Hugh Lawson recuses himself from York's case, after defense attorney suggests Lawson interfered with the plea bargain process by stating he does not except the plea, as he feels sentence should be much longer. Lawson Assigns case to Judge C. Ashley Royal.
- Oct. 28, 2003** Judge Royal orders a change of venue to his hometown of Brunswick Georgia for Malachi K. York's trial.
- Dec. 16, 2003** Government issues a federal superseding indictment, new charges include Racketeering and Money Structuring, as witness after witness deny ever being molested.
- Dec. 16, 2003** Court sets trial date of January 5, 2004, newly retained defense attorney Adrian L. Patrick has less than one month to prepare his case.
- Dec. 30, 2003** Judge Royal orders trial to be conducted in a constructively closed courtroom and the jury selection remains anonymous. Judge Royal forces Mr. York to keep discharged counsel.
- Jan. 19, 2004** Court held on Martin Luther King JRs Day, a statute holiday, violating a federal rule of criminal procedure, **5 USC§ 6103**, Rule number 56.
- Jan. 23, 2004** After a 15 day trial, York is found guilty of 10 of 11 counts of racketeering and Intent to transport minors across state lines for sexual purposes.
- Apr. 22, 2004** York is sentenced to 135 yrs and sent to Leavenworth Federal Prison, in Kansas.
- Apr. 23, 2004** Governments' key witness Habiybah Washington declares **York is not guilty**, signs 2 Affidavits but her testimony is blocked and further delayed.
- Aug. 13, 2004** Habiybah Washington withdraws her affidavits and motion for new trial is dismissed.
- Jan. 6, 2006** United States Court of Appeals for the 11th circuit enters a final judgment affirming York's conviction and sentence.
- Jun. 21, 2006** York's lawsuit is dismissed, days before York's Birthday.
- Jun. 26, 2006** United States Supreme Court denies York's application for a *writ of certiorari*, **2255** motion is filed. Notably, this is Mr. York's Birthday
- Jun. 20, 2007** York files civil action against Federal Bureau of Prisons, citing 8th Amendment violations of Cruel & Unusual Punishment and requesting medical transfer from U S P Super max Prison in Florence, CO.
- Mar. 25, 2008** Malachi K. York's Defense Attorney submits the response to **2255** motion.
- Feb. 18, 2009** Magistrate Judge recommends that Mr. York's motion to vacate, set aside or correct sentence pursuant to **28 U.S.C§ 2255** be denied.
- June 1, 2009** Malachi K. York's Civil Action against Federal Bureau of Prisons for Medical Transfer is denied.

Jul. 7, 2009

Judge C Ashley Royal enters a 43 page order denying Mr. York's previously filed *pro se* Constitutional Habeas Corpus.

Aug. 26, 2009

A certificate of appealability outlining the denial of Mr. York's constitutional rights, judicial biasness and prosecutorial misconduct, is filed at the U S District Courthouse in Macon GA.

September, 2009

The Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals reviews Mr. York's Certificate of appealability.
